FYI- the City of Plano's 11/5/19 City/School Election results were selected for the Post-Election Audit. The audit results matched the election equipment's results from election night.

Smith stated the County Attorney needs to see what the County can do about the delinquent Iconium Sewer account. Waits stated he spoke with her and the County can try to garnish their wages. Demry motioned to have the County Attorney's Office move in whatever direction needed to correct the issue. Seconded by Smith. All voted aye.

Demry motioned to set the public hearing for the FY20 County Budget Amendment for 12/2/2019 at 9:05 A.M. Seconded by Smith. All voted aye.

Brad Skinner, County Engineer, updated on Secondary Roads projects. They are working on cleanup projects from the snow storm, culverts, ditching and shaping of roads. They poured concrete for the fuel tank, which should arrive in 2 weeks. A couple more pours will be required for drainage purposes but can wait until spring if necessary. The Honeycreek Bridge on 160th will let tomorrow. A box culvert will replace the bridge. The motor grader repair is underway. Ziegler found a couple of additional issues and will provide a quote to repair.

Stephanie Koch, CDS Coordinator, provided an update. The first Children's Advisory Board meeting will be 11/21 at 2 P.M. in Ottumwa. C3 Training continues to go well. The next Governing Board meeting will be 12/5 at noon in Ottumwa. The Adult Advisory Board meeting will follow. She continues to work with many walk-ins that are seeking housing. The jail advisory program continues to go well.

APPANOOSE COUNTY POLICY FOR A DRUG AND ALCOHOL FREE WORKPLACE

I. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

Appanoose County recognizes the problems of substance abuse in society and in the workplace. Substance abuse poses a serious threat to our staff, customers, and property. By enacting a substance abuse policy and program, we hope to combat the problems associated with substance abuse by creating a drug and alcohol free workplace.

Our substance abuse policy seeks to balance our respect for individual privacy with our need to keep a safe, productive, drug and alcohol free environment. Our intention is to prevent substance abuse and promote its treatment. We encourage those who use drugs or who abuse alcohol to seek help in overcoming their problem.

With these basic objectives in mind, Appanoose County has established the following program and policies for a drug and alcohol free workplace.

WHILE THE COUNTY BELIEVES WHOLEHARTEDLY IN THE PLANS, POLICIES, AND PROCEDURES DESCRIBED, IT IS COMMITTED TO REVIEWING THEM CONTINUALLY, AND RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CHANGE, TO TERMINATE, OR TO DEVIATE FROM THEM AT ANY TIME. NOTHING IN THIS PROGRAM IN INTENDED, NOR SHOULD IT BE CONSTRUED, AS REQUIRING "CAUSE" FOR TERMINATION OR OTHERWISE ALTERING THE AT-WILL NATURE OF THE EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP.

II. DEFINITIONS

A. <u>"Abuse of alcohol or a legal drug"</u>: Any use of alcohol or a legal drug which impairs an individual's faculties (other than use of a legal drug in accordance with a lawful prescription).

B. "Alcohol": Any beverage containing ethanol.

C. <u>"Drug"</u>: Any drug or substance considered a controlled substance per Iowa Code Chapter 124, and any schedule I, II, III, IV, or V substance listed in the Controlled Substance Act, 21 U.S.C. §801.

D. <u>"Legal Drug"</u>: A drug for which there is a valid prescription, or an over-thecounter drug.

E. <u>"Prospective employee</u>": A person who has made application, whether written or oral, to Appanoose County to become an employee.

F. <u>"Sample"</u>: A sample from the human body capable of revealing the presence of alcohol or other drugs, or their metabolites, which shall include hair, urine, saliva, or breath.

III. WORK RULES

A. Legal Drugs

1. **Prescription Drugs**. An employee may bring to work and take prescription drugs during work hours only if the drug has been prescribed for the employee by a medical or dental provider, and only if the drug is taken in accordance with the prescriber's directions.

2. Over-the-Counter Drugs. An employee may bring to work and take over-the-counter drugs during work hours only if the drug is used for its intended purpose and in accordance with package directions and any supplemental direction of the employee's medical or dental provider.

3. Impairment from Using Lawful Drugs. An employee using prescription or over-the-counter drugs while working must rely on the warnings or cautions that are received with the particular drug. If the individual has an indication that the drug may effect performance, or there is a caution that one should not engage in certain activities that are part of the employee's job duties while taking the drug, the individual shall refrain from taking the drug while on the job, or not work while taking the particular drug. Appanoose County reserves the right to take appropriate action (including relieving the employee from work) if the use of a lawful drug is impairing, or is deemed likely to impair, the employee's faculties or work performance.

4. Abuse. Abuse of legal drugs will not be tolerated, and will be dealt with in the same manner as the use of a controlled substance.

B. Alcohol or Drug Possession, Transfer or Use, Other than Use Detected by a Drug or Alcohol Test

1. **Drug or Alcohol Possession**. Except as otherwise provided in Rule III-A, an employee bringing, attempting to bring, possessing, using, transferring, or attempting to transfer any alcoholic beverage or illegal drug on the County's premises or property, or to any County worksite, is guilty of misconduct and is subject to discipline, including suspension without pay or discharge.

2. Conviction of Drug Offenses. Any employee convicted or receiving a deferred judgment for possession or delivery of a controlled substance will be subject to is subject to discipline, including termination

C. Impairment During Work Hours

1. It is our intent that an employee whose faculties appear to be impaired

during work hours will not be allowed to work, regardless of the cause.

2. An employee whose faculties are impaired during work hours due to the effects of the use of alcohol or illegal use of a controlled substance, including the abuse of a legal drug, is subject to discipline, including termination. However, if a drug or alcohol test is done, discipline will be imposed only in accordance with Rule III-E below.

D. Prospective Employee Discipline in Connection with a Drug or Alcohol Test

Prospective employees shall be required to undergo a drug or alcohol test prior to being hired. A prospective employee's positive drug or alcohol test result, or the refusal of the prospective employee to provide a testing sample, will result in the County's refusal to hire the prospective employee. This does not prevent the prospective employee from later initiating another inquiry with the County.

E. Employee Discipline in Connection with a Drug or Alcohol Test

Employees may be required to undergo a drug or alcohol test under certain circumstances (see "Employee Substance Abuse Screening Program" below). Any action taken against the employee is based only on the results of the drug or alcohol test. The following is a list of uniform requirements for what action the County will take against the employee upon receipt of a confirmed positive drug or alcohol test result, or upon the employee's refusal to submit to such test:

1. **Refusal to Submit to a Drug or Alcohol Test.** An employee's refusal to submit to a drug or alcohol test when requested to do so is subject to discipline, including termination.

2. **Positive Drug Test Result.** An employee's first confirmed positive drug test is subject to discipline, including termination. Additionally, an individual admitting to current drug use, or that uses any method to adulterate or alter test results, is subject to discipline, including termination.

3. **Positive Alcohol Test Result**. If the first positive test for alcohol is between .02 and .08 BAC, the County will offer the employee an opportunity to enroll in an approved rehabilitation treatment program. If the employee successfully completes said program, the employee will not be subject to further discipline.

Any rehabilitation costs not covered by insurance shall be split equally between the parties, however, Appanoose County shall not be required to pay more than \$2,000 toward the cost not covered by insurance. The employee's first confirmed positive test for alcohol above .08 BAC will result in termination. Any employee showing signs of intoxication, or admitting to current alcohol use while on County premises, while engaged in County business, or while operating County equipment, will be drug tested. A second positive test for alcohol will result in termination.

4. **Pre-Result Suspension.** Prior to the County receiving the results of the employee's drug test, the employee's employment with the County will be suspended without pay, pending the outcome of the test. If the result of the test does not violate the terms of the written policy, the employee will be reinstated with back pay.

IV. DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING PROGRAMS

A. Pre-Employment Substance Abuse Screening Program

1. **Drug Testing.** Appanoose County will conduct pre-employment drug tests, which are designed to prevent hiring individuals who use controlled substances and/or abuse legal drugs or alcohol.

To the extent feasible, all precautions will be taken to ensure that the testing only measure, and the records concerning the testing only make use of information regarding drugs in the body. The following is a list of drugs for which testing will be conducted:

- Marijuana and its metabolites
- Cocaine
- Opiates (including morphine and codeine)
- Phencyclidine
- Amphetamines

2. Alcohol Testing. Appanoose County will conduct an alcohol test of prospective employees to whom a conditional offer of employment has been made. The alcohol test is designed to prevent hiring individuals who abuse alcohol. An alcohol concentration level of .02 or higher, is considered a positive alcohol test result and violates this policy.

B. Employee Substance Abuse Screening Program

An active employee may be requested or required to submit to a drug or alcohol test under any of the following circumstances:

1. **Reasonable Suspicion**. A specific active employee may be required to submit to a drug or alcohol test if the County has evidence that an employee is using or has used alcohol or drugs in violation of the County's written policy. This evidence must be drawn from specific, objective, and clear facts, and reasonable inferences drawn from those facts in light of experience. Examples that might support such are:

- Observations made at work, such as direct observation of alcohol or drug use, or the physical symptoms or being impaired by alcohol or drug use.
- Abnormal conduct or erratic behavior while at work or a significant deterioration in work performance.
- A report by a reliable and credible source of alcohol or drug use.
- Evidence that an individual has tampered with any alcohol or drug test during the individual's employment with the current employer.
- Evidence that an employee has caused an accident resulting in personal injury other than minor injuries requiring only first aid treatment and which do not involve medical treatment, loss of consciousness, restriction of work or motion, or transfer to another job, or property damage of \$1,500 or more. (The property damage threshold for Deputy Sheriff's shall be established at \$4,000).
- Evidence that an employee has manufactured, sold, distributed, solicited, possessed, used or transferred drugs while working, or while on the employer's premises, or while operating the employer's vehicle, machinery or equipment.

2. Alcohol Testing; The County has determined to conduct alcohol testing in an attempt to prevent employees from abusing alcohol. An alcohol concentration level of .02 or higher, expressed in terms of grams of alcohol per two hundred ten liters of breath, or its equivalent, is considered a positive alcohol test and violates this policy.

3. **Drug Testing**; The County has determined to conduct controlled substance, or "drug" testing in an attempt to discourage and prevent employees from illegally using drugs, be it the use of an illegal drug or the abuse of a legal drug. To the extent feasible, all precautions will be taken to ensure that the testing only measure, and the records concerning the testing only make use of information regarding drugs in the body. The following is a list of drugs for which testing will occur:

- Marijuana
- Cocaine
- Opiates (including morphine and codeine)
- Phencyclidine
- Amphetamines

4. **Test Scheduling**; Drug and alcohol testing shall occur during, or immediately before or after, a regular work period. The time required for testing, including

travel time, is considered work time for purposes of the FLSA, compensation, and benefits.
